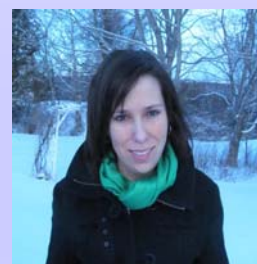
The ACC is pleased to announce the recent hiring of Tara Carlisle as the 2010 Conference Coordinator.
